Second Reading: Romans 8, 28-30

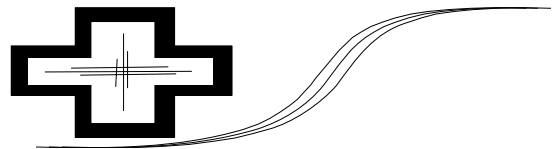
As heirs of God and heirs with Christ, we suffer in order to be glorified with Christ.

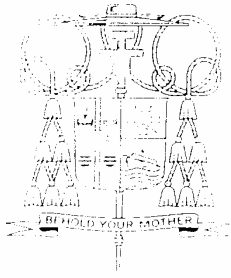
